ithout the support of the Santa Fe Business Incubator (SFBI), founded in 1998 by the City of Santa Fe, more than 200 small businesses may not have germinated or survived. Honeymoon Brewery and Kokopelli Landscaping are just two of the enterprises born from the initiative.

Business incubation is about nurturing new and small operations, supporting them through the early stages of development and growth, and creating "communities and networks," says Marie Longmerre, CEO and president since SFBI's inception. "It works on a spirit of sharing

between the entrepreneurs, the staff, the volunteers, and the broader community, as well as the partnerships and networks we help them build. That spirit of generosity and openness is the magic of incubation."
